

By Mr. Putnam of Needham, petition of Harold Putnam that the Director of the Division of Ocean Beaches be authorized to acquire Green Harbor Beach in the town of Marshfield and to maintain the same as a state beach. Harbors and Public Lands.

AN ACT TO CREATE A STATE BEACH AT GREEN HARBOR IN THE TOWN OF MARSHFIELD.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The director of the division of ocean
2 beaches in the department of public works is hereby au-
3 thorized and directed to acquire the fee, by eminent do-
4 main, by purchase or by gift, in Green Harbor beach in
5 the town of Marshfield, including all the beachfront but
6 not the abutting residences between Green Harbor river
7 and the town line between Marshfield and Duxbury, and
8 also in so much of the marshland along Green Harbor
9 river, and between Green Harbor river and Canal street
10 as may in the opinion of the director be required for park-
11 ing, boating and other purposes.

1 SECTION 2. The director is authorized and directed
2 to improve, supervise and maintain this beach in such a
3 manner as to be of greatest benefit to the people of the
4 commonwealth for recreational purposes, and in such a
5 manner as to preserve as far as possible the natural
6 beauty of the area.

1 SECTION 3. The director may expend for this purpose
2 such sums as may hereinafter be appropriated.
