**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Six.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE APPOINTMENT AND THE SALARY OF A SECOND ASSISTANT REGISTER OF PROBATE IN PLYMOUTH COUNTY.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 24 of chapter 217 of the General  
 2 Laws, as most recently amended by section 1 of chapter  
 3 464 of the acts of 1943, is hereby further amended by in-  
 4 serting after the word "Middlesex" in line 3 the word:  
 5 —, Plymouth, — so as to read as follows: — *Section 24.*  
 6 The judges of probate for the counties of Bristol, Essex,  
 7 Norfolk, Hampden, Middlesex, Plymouth, Suffolk and  
 8 Worcester may appoint a second assistant register for  
 9 their respective counties, who shall hold office for three  
 10 years unless sooner removed by the judge. They shall  
 11 be subject to the laws relative to assistant registers.

1 SECTION 2. Section 35B of said chapter 217, as most  
 2 recently amended by section 2 of chapter 638 of the acts  
 3 of 1955, is hereby further amended by striking out the  
 4 caption "Plymouth" and the schedule under said caption  
 5 and inserting in place thereof the following: —

*Plymouth.*

First assistant register . . . . .	\$5,000
Second assistant register . . . . .	4,500
