AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE COMPENSATION OF THE ASSOCIATE
COMMISSIONERS OF PUBLIC WORKS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 2 of chapter 16 of the General Laws, as most
2 recently amended by section 1 of chapter 776 of the
3 acts of 1950, is hereby further amended by striking out,
4 in line 10, the word "eight" and inserting in place
5 thereof the word: — eleven, — so as to read as follows: —
6 *Section 2.* There shall be a department of public works
7 which shall be under the supervision and control of a
8 commissioner of public works and two associate com-
9 missioners. Upon the expiration of the term of office of
10 a commissioner or an associate commissioner, his suc-
11 cessor shall be appointed for five years by the governor,
12 with the advice and consent of the council. The com-
13 missioner shall receive such salary, not exceeding fif-
14 teen thousand dollars, and the associate commissioners
15 such salaries, not exceeding eleven thousand dollars, as
16 the governor and council may determine. The com-
17 missioner and associate commissioners shall be allowed
18 their actual traveling and other necessary expenses.
