## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Six.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE CONTROL AND MAINTENANCE BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS OF THAT PORTION OF ROUTE 126, SO CALLED, FROM ITS INTERSECTION WITH WESTMINSTER STREET, BELLINGHAM, TO THE BELLINGHAM-MEDWAY TOWN LINE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. That portion of Route 126, so called,  
2 with any bridges thereon from its intersection with  
3 Westminster street, Bellingham, to the Bellingham-  
4 Medway town line shall be controlled and maintained  
5 by the department of public works.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

**The Government of Massachusetts**

in the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighteen

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE REGULATION OF THE BUSINESS OF THE INSURANCE COMPANIES OF THIS COMMONWEALTH, AND TO REVISE AND SUPPLEMENT THE SEVERAL ACTS RELATIVE TO THE REGULATION OF THE BUSINESS OF THE INSURANCE COMPANIES OF THIS COMMONWEALTH.

Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Town Meeting assembled and by the majority of the same, as follows:

SECTION 1. That portion of Article I, Chapter I, of the Constitution of the Commonwealth, which reads "The Legislature shall have the sole and exclusive power of raising and appropriating money, and of regulating the public debt, and of fixing and altering the public account," shall be construed and construed to include the regulation of the business of the insurance companies of this Commonwealth.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
