RESOLVE AUTHORIZING THE COMMITTEE ON MERCANTILE AFFAIRS TO SIT DURING THE RECESS OF THE GENERAL COURT TO INVESTIGATE THE EFFECT OF LIMITED ACCESS OR TOLL HIGHWAYS.

1 *Resolved*, That the committee on mercantile affairs is
2 hereby authorized to sit during the recess of the general
3 court for the purpose of investigating and studying the
4 effect of limited access or toll highways upon local zon-
5 ing and planning. Said committee may call upon the
6 department of commerce and other boards, commissions
7 and officers of the commonwealth for such information
8 as it may desire in the course of its investigation. Said
9 committee shall be provided with quarters in the state
10 house or elsewhere, shall hold public hearings, shall have
11 the power to summon witnesses and to require the pro-
12 duction of books, records, contracts and papers and the
13 giving of testimony under oath, and may expend for ex-
14 pert, clerical and other services and expenses such sums
15 as may be appropriated therefor. Said committee shall
16 make a report to the general court of the results of its
17 investigation and its recommendations, if any, together
18 with drafts of legislation necessary to carry its recom-
19 mendations into effect, by filing the same with the clerk
20 of the senate not later than the third Wednesday of
21 January, nineteen hundred and fifty-seven.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE REGISTRATION OF VOTERS.

Section 1. The Board of Registrars of the Commonwealth shall have the honor to certify to the Board of Registrars of the Commonwealth the names of the persons who are entitled to vote at the general election, and to the Board of Registrars of the Commonwealth the names of the persons who are not entitled to vote at the general election.
