### AN ACT REDUCING THE AGE FOR ELIGIBILITY FOR OLD AGE ASSISTANCE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 1 of chapter 118A of the General Laws, as

4 "minimum age" and ending with the words "old age  
5 assistance" and inserting in place thereof the following:  
6 — age of sixty.
