AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE SALE OR MANUFACTURE OF CONTAINERS USED FOR REFRIGERATIVE PURPOSES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 46 of chapter 271 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by adding at the end thereof the following
3 sentence: — Whoever manufactures or sells a container
4 to be used for refrigerative purposes unless the container
5 may be easily opened from the inside shall be punished
6 by a fine of not more than one hundred dollars.
