AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE GRANTING OF AN ANNUITY TO THE SURVIVING SPOUSE OF ANY PUBLIC OFFICIAL OR EMPLOYEE WHO HAS BEEN RETIRED OR PENSIONED UNDER ANY NON-CONTRIBUTORY RETIREMENT SYSTEM.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 32 of the General Laws (Ter. Ed.) is hereby
2 amended by inserting after section 95 the following sec-
3 tion:—

4 *Section 95A.* For the purpose of promoting the public
5 good, and in consideration of long and meritorious service
6 of any official or employee who has been retired or pen-
7 sioned under any non-contributory system, a city or
8 town may grant an annuity to his surviving spouse who
9 is not receiving a retirement allowance or pension under
10 the provisions of any general or special law, and so long
11 as such spouse survives and does not remarry, or if no
12 surviving spouse, to a legal guardian, for the benefit of
13 any surviving child who is unmarried and under age
14 eighteen, in such amount as it may determine, but not
15 to exceed one half of the regular annual compensation
16 received by such official or employee or two thousand
17 dollars, whichever is less; provided, that such official or
18 employee has been permanently employed on full-time
19 basis by such city or town for not less than fifteen years.
