

By Mr. O'Farrell of Malden, petition of George H. O'Farrell and Anthony M. Colonna that Nellie C. Doughten, because of service as a correction officer at the Reformatory for Women in Framingham, be made eligible for membership in the state retirement system. Pensions and Old Age Assistance.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT NELLIE C. DOUGHTEN SHALL BE ELIGIBLE FOR MEMBERSHIP IN THE CONTRIBUTORY RETIREMENT SYSTEM FOR STATE EMPLOYEES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. For the purpose of promoting the public
2 good, and in consideration of her long and meritorious
3 service as a permanent senior female correction officer
4 at the reformatory for women in Framingham, Massa-
5 chusetts, Nellie C. Doughten may, any provision of
6 general or special law to the contrary notwithstanding,
7 become a member of the state retirement system by
8 filing with the state retirement board, within and not
9 later than sixty days from the effective date of this act,
10 an application on a prescribed form for membership in
11 the state retirement system; but she shall not be entitled
12 to full credit for service rendered prior to the date of
13 her becoming such member unless, within six months
14 from the effective date of this act, she shall have paid
15 into the annuity savings fund of the state retirement
16 system, in one sum, a sum equal to the contributions
17 she would have been required to pay had she applied
18 for membership and been accepted in said retirement
19 system when first eligible to become a member.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take full effect upon its
2 passage.
