AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF A REGISTRATION CERTIFICATE TO EACH JOINT OWNER OF A MOTOR VEHICLE OR TRAILER.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 30 of chapter 90 of the General Laws, as
2 appearing in the Tercentenary Edition thereof, is hereby
3 amended by striking out the second sentence and sub-
4 stituting therefor the following new sentence:— The
5 registrar may issue a certified copy, attested by him or
6 his authorized agent, of any certificate of registration
7 or of any license to operate motor vehicles which may
8 have been lost or mutilated upon the written request
9 of the person entitled thereto, or, where there are two
10 or more joint owners of a motor vehicle or trailer, he
11 may issue a certificate to each joint owner upon written
12 request of the person entitled thereto; and such certified
13 copies shall have the same force and effect as the
14 originals.
