By Mr. Nourse of Medfield, petition of William F. Nourse for legislation to authorize the Registrar of Motor Vehicles to permit the reduction in size of motor vehicle registration plates. Highways and Motor Vehicles.

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE REGISTRAR OF MOTOR VEHICLES
TO PERMIT THE TRIMMING OF CERTAIN NUMBER PLATES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The number plates furnished by the registrar of motor
2 vehicles to every person whose motor vehicle is regis-
3 tered in the year nineteen hundred and fifty-six under
4 the provisions of chapter ninety of the General Laws
5 may be reduced in size to not less than twelve inches
6 long or six inches high at the direction of the registrar,
7 provided that no part of the inscription is removed or
8 covered.

9 This authorization may be used only in the case of a
10 nineteen hundred and fifty-seven model motor vehicle
11 produced in the year nineteen hundred and fifty-six on
12 which provision has been made for the mounting of
13 plates no larger than twelve inches wide and six inches
14 high.
