AN ACT PROVIDING THAT THE CITY OF BOSTON WIDEN CERTAIN STREETS IN THE HYDE PARK DISTRICT OF THE CITY OF BOSTON.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The city of Boston is hereby directed to
2 widen River street in the Hyde Park section of the city
3 of Boston from Cleary square to Logan square and to
4 widen Fairmount avenue in said section from Logan
5 square to North street.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its accep-
2 tance by the city council of the city of Boston and the
3 approval of the mayor.

has the honor to acknowledge the receipt of the report of the Board of Public Health, dated the 15th day of January, 1905, and to express its appreciation of the thoroughness and accuracy of the same.

It is the duty of the Commission to consider the report of the Board of Public Health, and to recommend such measures as may be deemed proper for the improvement of the administration of the City of Boston.

1. That the Board of Public Health be continued in its present position.
2. That the Board of Public Health be authorized to employ such assistants as may be deemed necessary.
3. That the Board of Public Health be authorized to employ such clerical assistants as may be deemed necessary.
4. That the Board of Public Health be authorized to employ such janitors as may be deemed necessary.
5. That the Board of Public Health be authorized to employ such messengers as may be deemed necessary.

Section 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage, and the Commission on the Administration of the City of Boston and the Board of Public Health be authorized to carry out the provisions of this act.
