RESOLVE ESTABLISHING A SPECIAL COMMISSION TO INVESTIGATE, STUDY AND CLARIFY THE DEMERIT SYSTEM.

1 *Resolved*, That an unpaid special commission, to
2 consist of two members of the senate to be designated
3 by the president thereof, three members of the house
4 of representatives to be designated by the speaker
5 thereof, two persons to be appointed by the governor,
6 is hereby established for the purpose of making an
7 investigation and study to clarify the demerit system
8 currently in operation throughout the commonwealth.
9 Said commission shall be provided with quarters in the
10 state house or elsewhere and may require by summons
11 the attendance and testimony of witnesses and the
12 production of records and may travel within the com-
13 monwealth. Said commission may expend for clerical
14 and other services and expenses such sums as may be
15 appropriated therefor. Said commission shall report to
16 the general court the results of its investigation and
17 study, and its recommendations, if any, together with
18 drafts of legislation necessary to carry such recommenda-
19 tions into effect, by filing with the clerk of the house of
20 representatives not later than the first Wednesday of
21 December in the current year.
