MEMORANDUM OF COMMISSIONER OF CORPORATIONS AND TAXATION PURSUANT TO GENERAL LAWS, CHAPTER 3, SECTION 7, WITH RESPECT TO PETITION OF THE DANVERS POLICE RELIEF ASSOCIATION, INC.

NOVEMBER 22, 1955.

To the Honorable Senate and House of Representatives.

The above-named petition was transmitted to me by the Clerk of the House of Representatives on November 18, 1955, with a request for a memorandum.

Danvers Police Relief Association, Inc. was organized on April 6, 1955, under chapter 176 of the General Laws. The subject matter of that which is being sought by the proposed legislation comes within the exclusive jurisdiction of the Insurance Commissioner. It is, therefore, respectfully suggested that his opinion be sought on the merits of the said legislation.

No fee is required to be paid by a corporation of this type.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO MEMBERSHIP IN THE DANVERS POLICE RELIEF ASSOCIATION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Whenever a member of the Danvers Police Relief As-
2 sociation, Inc. ceases to be a member of the Danvers
3 police department, he shall cease to be a member of said
4 association and shall no longer be entitled to any benefits
5 therefrom; provided, however, that any member of said
6 association who ceases to be a member of the Danvers
7 police department by reason of being pensioned from
8 said department shall within thirty days of such retire-
9 ment be paid from the funds of said association a sum
10 of money equal to the death benefit.
