The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Six.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO VACATION SALARY OR WAGES OF CERTAIN MUNICIPAL OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES UNDER CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 111E of chapter 41 of the General Laws, as
2 most recently amended by chapter 13 of the acts of
3 1954, is hereby further amended by adding at the end
4 the following sentence: — The provisions of this section
5 shall also apply to any person not subject to any of the
6 aforesaid sections whose service is terminated as afore-
7 said without his having been granted the vacation to
8 which he is entitled under a by-law, ordinance or execu-
9 tive order; provided, that such by-law, ordinance or
10 executive order so provides.

Approved by the House, as amended, on January 2, 1902, for
 a bill with the following title: "An Act to amend the
 laws relating to the office of the Secretary of the
 House of Representatives." January 21.

The Amendments of the Constitution

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Six

THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA,
 IN SENATE CONFERENCE WITH THE SENATE, PASSED THE FOLLOWING
 RESOLUTIONS:

That the following amendments to the Constitution of the United States
 be and they are hereby recommended to the Senate for their
 ratification:

1. Section 1111 of chapter 41 of the Revised Laws of the
 United States, approved by chapter 18 of the acts of
 1901, is hereby further amended by striking in the said
 section the following words: "The provisions of this section
 shall not apply to any person not subject to the laws of the
 United States, whose name is transmitted to the
 Secretary of the House of Representatives for the purpose of
 being admitted under a privilege, exemption or other
 right conferred by law upon any person, and the
 provisions of this section shall not apply to any person
 who is not a citizen of the United States." and inserting
 in lieu thereof the following words: "The provisions of this
 section shall not apply to any person not subject to the laws
 of the United States, whose name is transmitted to the
 Secretary of the House of Representatives for the purpose of
 being admitted under a privilege, exemption or other
 right conferred by law upon any person, and the provisions
 of this section shall not apply to any person who is not a
 citizen of the United States."
