AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE GIVING OF NOTICES OF DECREES AND ORDERS OF PROBATE COURTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 36 of chapter 215 of the General Laws, as ap-
2 pearing in the Tercentenary Edition, is hereby amended
3 by inserting after the word "writing", in line 1, the
4 words:—and notices thereof shall be given by the
5 registers to the attorneys of record, and in the absence
6 of an attorney of record, to the party,—so as to read
7 as follows:—*Section 36.* Decrees and orders of pro-
8 bate courts shall be in writing and notices thereof shall
9 be given by the registers to the attorneys of record, and
10 in the absence of an attorney of record, to the party.
11 The registers shall record in books kept therefor such
12 decrees, orders and other proceedings in said courts and
13 such instruments, as shall be determined by rules made
14 from time to time under section thirty.
