RESOLVE INCREASING THE SCOPE OF THE INVESTIGATION  
AND STUDY BY THE SPECIAL COMMISSION ON TAXATION.

1     *Resolved*, That the unpaid special commission, known  
2 as the special commission on taxation, established by  
3 chapter eighty-six of the resolves of nineteen hundred  
4 and forty-eight, and most recently continued by chapter  
5 one hundred and thirty-four of the resolves of nineteen  
6 hundred and fifty-five, shall, in making its investigation  
7 and study, consider the subject matter of current house  
8 document numbered 2341, relative to the exemption of  
9 income earned in the commonwealth by non-resident  
10 employees of railroads, and of current house document  
11 numbered 2350, relative to repealing the law relative to  
12 the taxation of income earned in the commonwealth by  
13 non-residents.
