RESOLUTIONS ON THE DEATH OF ALBEN W. BARKLEY.

Whereas, The House of Representatives learns with sorrow of the death of Alben W. Barkley, the distinguished statesman from Kentucky, former Vice President of the United States; and

Whereas, During his long service to the nation, as a representative, senator and Vice President, he won the respect and admiration of all Americans, regardless of partisan affiliations; and

Whereas, The Commonwealth may rightly grieve when death ends the public service of a fearless leader and kindly and capable man whose whole life was devoted to the service of our country; therefore be it

Resolved, That the Massachusetts House of Representatives hereby extends to his bereaved family its profound sympathy in the great loss that has come to them; and be it further

Resolved, That these resolutions be entered on the Journal of the House and an engrossed copy thereof be sent by the Secretary of the Commonwealth to the family of the deceased.
