RESOLUTIONS ON THE DEATH OF HONORABLE JOSEPH L. HURLEY.

Whereas, The House of Representatives learns with regret of the death of Honorable Joseph L. Hurley, associate Justice of the Superior Court; and

Whereas, The death of this able and conscientious jurist brings to an end a distinguished career in public service during which he served as mayor of the city of Fall River, as Lieutenant-Governor of the Commonwealth and finally as an outstanding member of the Judiciary; and

Whereas, The Commonwealth may justly grieve at the death of one of her most respected and distinguished sons; therefore be it

Resolved, That the House of Representatives of the General Court of Massachusetts expresses to his bereaved family its profound sympathy in the great loss which has come to them; and be it further
