PROPOSAL FOR A LEGISLATIVE AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION PROVIDING FOR VOTING BY CITIZENS OF EIGHTEEN YEARS OF AGE AND UPWARDS.

1 A majority of all the members elected to the Senate
2 and House of Representatives, in joint session, hereby
3 declares it to be expedient to alter the Constitution by
4 the adoption of the following Article of Amendment, to
5 the end that it may become a part of the Constitution
6 [if similarly agreed to in a joint session of the next
7 General Court and approved by the people at the state
8 election next following]:

9 ARTICLE OF AMENDMENT.

10 Article III of the Amendments to the Constitution,
11 as amended, is hereby further amended by striking out,
12 in the first line, the word "twenty-one" and inserting in
13 place thereof the word: — eighteen.
