AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE DISPOSITION OF CERTAIN LEGACIES OR DISTRIBUTIVE SHARES OF ESTATES OF DECEASED PERSONS WHEREIN THE LEGATEES OR DISTRIBUTEES RESIDE IN COUNTRIES UNDER COMMUNIST CONTROL.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 206 of the General Laws is hereby amended
2 by inserting after section 27A the following section:—
3 *Section 27B.* Whenever payment of a legacy or dis-
4 tributive share is to be made to a person who is domi-
5 ciled in a country or state known to be controlled by a
6 communist government, the court, on petition of an
7 interested party or in its discretion, may order that
8 such legacy or distributive share be converted into
9 necessaries of life by the executor or administrator and
10 shipped to such legatee or distributee through a recog-
11 nized public or private agency.
