AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE TRANSFER OF THE CARE, CONTROL AND MAINTENANCE OF CERTAIN WAYS IN THE CITY OF BOSTON TO THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The metropolitan district commission,  
2 on behalf of the commonwealth, is hereby authorized and  
3 directed to take over the care, control and maintenance  
4 of the following highways, located in the Roxbury,  
5 Jamaica Plain, Forest Hills and Dorchester sections of  
6 the city of Boston: — Embankment road, the Riverway,  
7 the Jamaicaway, the Arborway, and that section of  
8 Morton street between Washington street and Blue  
9 Hill avenue.

1 SECTION 2. Lines defining the limits of said juris-  
2 diction shall be determined by the commissioner of the  
3 metropolitan district commission and the park com-  
4 missioner of the city of Boston.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
