AN ACT TO PROVIDE AGAINST LOSS OF PAY OR VACATION TO CERTAIN STATE, COUNTY AND MUNICIPAL EMPLOYEES IN THE MILITIA.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

The Constitution of Massachusetts

As amended to the 19th of March 1878

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS, AS AMENDED TO THE 19TH OF MARCH 1878.

ARTICLE I.

SECTION I.

1. The legislative power shall be vested in a Senate and House of Representatives, who shall be styled the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

2. The Senate shall be composed of not more than eight members, and the House of Representatives of not more than thirty members, chosen by the qualified electors of the Commonwealth.

3. The members of the Senate shall be chosen by the qualified electors of the Commonwealth, and shall hold office for two years, and shall be eligible for re-election.

4. The members of the House of Representatives shall be chosen by the qualified electors of the Commonwealth, and shall hold office for two years, and shall be eligible for re-election.

5. The members of the Senate and House of Representatives shall be chosen in the following manner:

6. The Senate shall be chosen by the qualified electors of the Commonwealth, and shall hold office for two years, and shall be eligible for re-election.

7. The House of Representatives shall be chosen by the qualified electors of the Commonwealth, and shall hold office for two years, and shall be eligible for re-election.

8. The members of the Senate and House of Representatives shall be chosen in the following manner:
