AN ACT TO ADJUST THE SALARIES OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC UTILITIES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 2 of chapter 25 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by striking out the fifth sentence, as most
3 recently amended by section 38 of chapter 730 of the
4 acts of 1955, and inserting in place thereof the following
5 sentence:— The chairman shall receive such salary,
6 not exceeding fifteen thousand dollars, and each of the
7 other commissioners such salary, not exceeding twelve
8 thousand five hundred dollars, as the governor and
9 council determine.
