AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE SALARY OF THE JUSTICE OF THE MUNICIPAL COURT OF THE SOUTH BOSTON DISTRICT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The first paragraph of section 6 of chap-
2 ter 218 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
3 inserting after the word "Worcester" in line 2 the
4 words:—, the municipal court of the South Boston
5 district.

1 SECTION 2. Section 78 of said chapter 218, as most
2 recently amended by section 1 of chapter 741 of the
3 acts of 1955, is hereby further amended by striking out,
4 in lines 14 and 15, the words " , municipal court of the
5 South Boston district."
