To accompany the petition of Silvio O. Conte and Wallace B. Crawford for legislation relative to the supplementing of personnel, equipment and services at the weather station in the city of Pittsfield. State Administration.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Six.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE SUPPLEMENTING OF PERSONNEL,
EQUIPMENT AND SERVICES AT THE WEATHER STATION IN
THE CITY OF PITTSFIELD.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The department of commerce is hereby authorized and
2 directed to install, subject to the approval of the United
3 States Weather Bureau, radar equipment at the weather
4 station in the city of Pittsfield for the purpose of supple-
5 menting the services of said bureau. The commissioner
6 of commerce shall appoint two persons who shall serve
7 at said station in co-operation with the federal personnel
8 for the purpose of operating said equipment and furnish-
9 ing data on weather conditions, road conditions and other
10 meteorological information as may be helpful for the
11 safety and protection of the public and in the interests of
12 agriculture and commerce.

13 For the purpose of this act, the said department may
14 expend such sums as may be appropriated therefor.

The Constitution of the State

Article I, Section 1, Clause 2, provides that the Senate shall have the sole and exclusive power of impeachment.

Article II, Section 1, Clause 1, provides that the President shall have the power to grant reprieves and pardons for offenses against the United States, except in cases of impeachment.
