AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE PROPER IDENTIFICATION OF TAXICABS OR HACKNEY CARRIAGES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 22 of chapter 40 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by inserting after the first sentence the follow-
3 ing sentence: — Every hackney carriage or taxicab shall
4 have marked thereon, in plainly visible letters not less
5 than four inches high, the name and address of the
6 owner of said vehicle.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
the year one thousand nine hundred and four, that the
following

1. Section 22 of chapter 106 of the General Laws is hereby
2. amended by inserting after the first sentence the following
3. sentence:—Every person who registers a patent shall
4. have marked thereon in plain English letters and not
5. less than four inches high the name and address of the
6. owner of said patent.
