**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Six.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF A QUESTION RELATING TO ZONING (PROTECTIVE) BY-LAWS TO THE VOTERS OF THE TOWN OF ROWLEY.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. At the annual meeting for the election of  
2 officers in the town of Rowley, to be held in March of  
3 nineteen hundred and fifty-six, there shall be submitted  
4 to the voters thereof the following question which shall  
5 be placed upon the official ballot to be used for the  
6 election of town officers at said meeting: — “Shall Zon-  
7 ing (Protective) By-Laws be adopted in this town, in  
8 accordance with the final report of the Planning Board  
9 on file with the Town Clerk, which report recommends  
10 the adoption of the Proposed Protective Zoning By-laws  
11 and Map as printed in the Latest (nineteen hundred and  
12 fifty-five) Town Report?”

1 SECTION 2. If a majority of the voters present and  
2 voting on said question at said meeting vote in the  
3 affirmative, this act shall become effective and Zoning  
4 (Protective) By-laws shall be deemed to be adopted in  
5 this town, subject to the provisions of law regulating  
6 the adoption of Zoning By-laws.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

## The Constitution of the State

As amended by the Legislature of 1901

ARTICLE I. SECTION 1. All legislative powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

SECTION 2. (1) The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People in each State, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors in that State.

(2) No Representative shall, when elected, be more than seven Years of Age, and he shall, when elected, have been seven Years a Citizen of the United States, and for the last three Years a Citizen of that State in which he shall be chosen. (3) No Representative shall, when elected, be an Inhabitant of that State in which he shall be chosen. (4) The Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors in that State.

SECTION 3. (1) The House of Representatives shall assemble at least once in every Year, and the Meeting shall begin on the first Monday in December, unless otherwise provided by Law. (2) The Congress shall assemble at least once in every Year, and the Meeting shall begin on the first Monday in December, unless otherwise provided by Law.
