RESOLUTIONS ON THE DEATH OF JAMES A. O'BRIEN.

Whereas, The Massachusetts Senate has learned with deep sorrow of the death of James A. O'Brien of Fall River, a member of the House of Representatives, who died on August sixth, nineteen hundred and fifty-six, after a lingering illness; and

Whereas, His honored and long career as a member of the House of Representatives from nineteen hundred and forty-three to nineteen hundred and fifty-six distinguished him as an upright and conscientious legislator, an outstanding orator, fearless in the discharge of his duty, and courageous in the face of a long illness; therefore be it
