RESOLUTIONS URGING THE ADOPTION OF AN OFFICIAL SONG FOR
GOLD STAR MOTHERS' ORGANIZATIONS.

Whereas, It is fitting and appropriate that tribute be ever paid to those Gold Star Mothers of our country; therefore be it

Resolved, That the General Court of Massachusetts respectfully urges the Congress of the United States to have the song "Gold Star Mothers" by Mrs. Connie Briglow of Worcester, Massachusetts, declared the official national song of all Gold Star Mothers, organizations; and be it further

Resolved, That copies of these resolutions be transmitted forthwith by the secretary of the commonwealth to each member of the congress from the commonwealth.
