
To accompany the petition of Silvio O. Conte that provision be made for study by a special commission (including members of the General Court) of the laws relating to rights of way to the great ponds of the Commonwealth, Harbors and Public Lands.

RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR A STUDY BY AN UNPAID SPECIAL COMMISSION OF THE LAWS RELATING TO RIGHTS OF WAY TO THE GREAT PONDS OF THE COMMONWEALTH.

1 *Resolved*, That an unpaid special commission, to consist of
2 three members of the senate to be designated by the presi-
3 dent thereof, five members of the house of representatives to
4 be designated by the speaker thereof, and three persons to be
5 appointed by the governor, is hereby established for the pur-
6 pose of making a study of the laws pertaining to rights of
7 way to the great ponds of the commonwealth, with a view
8 to revising said laws. Said commission may expend for legal,
9 clerical and other necessary expenses such sums as may be
10 appropriated. Said commission shall report to the general
11 court the results of its study, and its recommendations, if
12 any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry
13 such recommendations into effect, by filing the same with
14 the clerk of the senate on or before the third Wednesday of
15 January in the year nineteen hundred and fifty-eight.

In compliance with the resolution of the Senate, passed on the 12th day of January, 1901, and the resolution of the House, passed on the 12th day of January, 1901, the following report is submitted to the Senate and the House:

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and One

Having provided for a study by an unpaid special commission on the subject of the laws relating to rights of way in the great parks of the Commonwealth.

1. Resolved, That an unpaid special commission, to consist of three members of the Senate to be designated by the presiding officer, four members of the House of Representatives to be designated by the speaker thereof, and three persons to be appointed by the Governor, be and is hereby established for the purpose of making a study of the laws pertaining to rights of way in the great parks of the Commonwealth, with a view to recommending such laws as may be deemed necessary to be enacted and other necessary reports, such as may be required.
2. Said commission shall report to the General Court the results of its study and its recommendations, if any, together with such other information as may be deemed necessary to carry out its recommendations into effect, by the first day of the month of January in the year nineteen hundred and one.
