To accompany the petition of John E. Powers and Arthur J. Mullen for legislation to authorize certain persons to become registered as instructors by the Board of Registration of Hairdressers upon passing examinations satisfactory to the board. Public Health.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING CERTAIN PERSONS NOT REGISTERED AND PRACTICING AS HAIRDRESSERS IN THE COMMONWEALTH TO BECOME REGISTERED AS INSTRUCTORS BY THE BOARD OF REGISTRATION OF HAIRDRESSERS UPON PASSING EXAMINATIONS SATISFACTORY TO THE BOARD.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 87BB of chapter 112 of the General Laws, as most
2 recently amended by section 7 of chapter 565 of the acts of
3 1943, is hereby further amended by adding at the end the
4 two following paragraphs:—

5 Any person who was licensed and practiced as an instructor
6 for a period of at least three years in another state and who
7 submits notarized affidavits in proof of such practice, may
8 file an application, accompanied by the proper fee as pro-
9 vided in section eighty-seven CC, for examination as a hair-
10 dresser and, upon passing an examination satisfactory to the
11 board and being registered as a hairdresser, may then file an
12 application, with the proper fee, for examination as an in-
13 structor and, upon passing both a written and practical ex-
14 amination satisfactory to the board may be registered by the
15 board as an instructor and may practice as an instructor in

16 any registered school during the period of original registra-
17 tion, and thereafter upon payment annually of a renewal fee
18 as provided in said section eighty-seven CC.

19 Any person who was licensed and practicing as a hairdresser
20 for a period of five years in another state and who submits
21 notarized affidavits as proof of such practice, may file an
22 application, accompanied by the proper fee as provided in
23 section eighty-seven CC, for examination as a hairdresser and
24 upon passing an examination satisfactory to the board and
25 being registered as a hairdresser, may then file an application
26 for examination with the proper fee as an instructor and upon
27 passing both a written and practical examination satisfactory
28 to the board, may be registered by the board as an instructor
29 and may practice as an instructor in any registered school
30 during the period of original registration, and thereafter upon
31 payment annually of a renewal fee as provided in said section
32 eighty-seven CC.
