AN ACT EXTENDING THE TIME WITHIN WHICH CERTAIN SOLDIERS AND SAILORS AND THEIR WIVES, WIDOWS, FATHERS OR MOTHERS MAY FILE APPLICATION FOR ABATEMENT OR EXEMPTION OF TAXES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 534 of the acts of 1949 is hereby amended by
2 striking out section 3, as amended by chapter 287 of the acts
3 of 1956, and inserting in place thereof the following section: —
4 *Section 3.* Application for abatement or exemption, as
5 provided in sections one and two, of taxes levied in the year
6 nineteen hundred and fifty-six may be made not later than
7 October first, nineteen hundred and fifty-seven, notwith-
8 standing any provision of law to the contrary.

 striking out section 2, as amended by chapter 201 of the Acts
 of 1955, and inserting in place thereof the following to-wit:
 Section 2. Application for admission to be admitted as
 a lawyer in sections one and two of laws passed in the year
 nineteen hundred and fifty-six may be made not later than
 October first, nineteen hundred and fifty-six, and shall
 be standing and provision of law to the contrary.
