## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

*Ordered,* That the joint special committee on the reorganization of the correctional system, created by order adopted in concurrence by the house on March sixth and by the senate on March twelfth, nineteen hundred and fifty-seven, is hereby continued for the purpose of completing the study and investigation of the reorganization of the correctional system and such other subject matter of senate document numbered seven hundred and fifty of the year nineteen hundred and fifty-five as it may deem necessary or desirable. Said committee shall be furnished with quarters in the state house or elsewhere, may hold public hearings, may travel within and without the commonwealth, shall have the power to summons witnesses and to require the production of books, records and papers as it deems necessary. Said committee may expend for legal, clerical and other services such sums as may hereafter be appropriated therefor. Said committee may sit during the recess of the General Court, and may report thereto from time to time the results of its investigation and study and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such recommendations into effect, and shall file its final report with the Clerk of the house of representatives not later than the fourth Wednesday in January, nineteen hundred and fifty-eight.
