RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY AN UNPAID SPECIAL COMMISSION RELATIVE TO THE CREATION OF A METROPOLITAN DISTRICT AND A METROPOLITAN PLANNING COUNCIL, AND CERTAIN RELATED MATTERS.

1 *Resolved*, That an unpaid special commission to consist of
2 two members of the senate to be designated by the president
3 thereof, three members of the house of representatives to
4 be designated by the speaker thereof and two persons to be
5 appointed by the governor, is hereby established for the pur-
6 pose of making an investigation and study relative to the
7 creation of a metropolitan district and a metropolitan plan-
8 ning council, and certain related matters. Said commission
9 shall consider the subject matter of current house documents
10 numbered 1271, 1880, 2199 and 2371. Said commission shall
11 be provided with quarters in the state house or elsewhere and
12 may expend for clerical or other assistance such sums as may
13 be appropriated therefor. Said commission shall report to
14 the general court the results of its study and its recommenda-
15 tions, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to
16 carry said recommendations into effect, by filing the same with
17 the clerk of the senate on or before the fourth Wednesday of
18 January, nineteen hundred and fifty-eight.
