AN ACT RELATIVE TO RECOMPUTING THE RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE OF HARRY G. WAITE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special
2 law to the contrary, Harry G. Waite, a retired employee of
3 the department of public works, shall, for the purpose of
4 recomputing his retirement allowance under the State Em-
5 ployees Retirement System be credited with such regular
6 deductions as would have been made by him during the
7 period from September twenty-third, nineteen hundred and
8 forty-two, to the effective date of his retirement on the basis
9 as if during this period he had been continuously in the
10 employ of the commonwealth and had been paid the salary
11 of a skilled laborer, PWD (chauffeur laborer), salary grade
12 7B.
