The committee on Bills in the Third Reading to which was referred the Senate Bill providing for compensation to dependents of certain officers or enlisted persons of the armed forces of the commonwealth whose death resulted from injuries while on certain duties and providing for the payment of a sum of money to John A. and Pauline J. DeMarco of North Adams (Senate, No. 781), reports recommending that the same be amended by substituting therefor a "Resolve in favor of John A. and Pauline J. DeMarco" (Senate, No. 787), and that, when so amended, the same will be correctly drawn.

RESOLVE IN FAVOR OF JOHN A. AND PAULINE J. DEMARCO.

1 *Resolved*, That for the purpose of discharging a moral
2 obligation of the commonwealth, and after an appropriation
3 has been made therefor, there shall be allowed and paid out of
4 the state treasury to John A. and Pauline J. DeMarco, jointly,
5 parents of Corporal Robert B. DeMarco, late of North
6 Adams, who, while in the line of duty as a member of the
7 Massachusetts Army National Guard and while riding in an
8 army vehicle, was killed on December seventeenth, nineteen
9 hundred and fifty-four, the sum of twenty-five dollars weekly
10 for a period of two hundred weeks, said period to begin
11 September second, nineteen hundred and fifty-seven. No
12 payment shall be made hereunder until there has been filed
13 with the comptroller an affidavit signed by the said John A.
14 and Pauline J. DeMarco that no money has been or will be
15 paid to anyone to secure the passage of this resolve.
