RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION RELATIVE TO THE NECESSITY FOR THE NUMBER OF TEMPORARY PERSONS EMPLOYED DURING THE SUMMER PERIOD TO PERFORM WORK UPON THE STATE HIGHWAYS.

1 *Resolved*, That an unpaid special commission to consist of two  
2 members of the senate to be designated by the president thereof,  
3 three members of the house of representatives to be designated  
4 by the speaker thereof, and two persons to be appointed by the  
5 governor, is hereby established to make an investigation and  
6 study relative to the necessity for the number of temporary  
7 persons employed during the summer period to perform work  
8 upon the state highways.

9 Said commission shall be provided with quarters in the state  
10 house or elsewhere, and may expend for legal, technical, clerical  
11 and other services such sums as may be appropriated therefor.  
12 Said commission may hold hearings, may summon and examine  
13 witnesses and require by subpoena the production of books and  
14 papers, and may travel within the commonwealth in the per-  
15 formance of its duties. Said commission shall report to the  
16 general court the results of its investigation and study, and its  
17 recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation  
18 necessary to carry such recommendations into effect, by filing  
19 the same with the clerk of the senate on or before the fourth  
20 Wednesday of January in the current year.
