The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Eight.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF BELMONT TO EMPLOY TEMPORARY LABORERS WHO SHALL NOT BE SUBJECT TO CIVIL SERVICE LAWS AND REGULATIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any contrary provisions of law, the town of
2 Belmont may employ temporary laborers for a period not to
3 exceed ninety days at any one time and such employment shall
4 not be subject to the provisions of chapter thirty-one of the
5 General Laws.

The Commission of Appointments

That the Commission of Appointments be and they are hereby authorized to exercise the powers and perform the duties conferred upon them by the Constitution and the laws of the State.

2. Before and upon temporary absence for a period not to
3. exceed thirty days at any one time and such suspension shall
4. not be subject to the provisions of chapter thirteen of the
5. General Laws.
