AN ACT PROVIDING FOR ADDITIONAL UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION  
PAYMENTS TO RECIPIENTS FOR EACH DEPENDENT CHILD.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

## The Commission of Investigation
