AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION TO ACQUIRE BROADSOUND AVENUE IN THE BEACHMONT SECTION OF REVERE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 The metropolitan district commission is hereby authorized
- 2 and directed to take by eminent domain, and thereafter to main-
- 3 tain, Broadsound avenue in the Beachmont section of Revere.

The Constitution of the State

Article I. Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

The Senate shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature thereof, for six years; and each Senator shall have one Vote. Immediately after they shall be assembled in Consequence of the first Meeting of the State Legislatures, they shall be divided into three equal Classes, in each of which one shall hold Office for the Term of two Years, one for four Years, and one for six Years; and provided always, that no Senator shall have been two Years in Office.
