AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE RIGHTS OF MEMBERS OF CERTAIN CORPORATIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 180 of the General Laws is hereby amended by in-
2 serting after section 26A, as most recently amended by section 17
3 of chapter 698 of the acts of 1957, the following new section:—
4 *Section 26B. Rights of Members of Certain Corporations.*—
5 No member of any corporation heretofore or hereafter organized
6 under general or special law for any purpose mentioned in sec-
7 tion twenty-six shall be expelled by vote of less than three
8 quarters of the members present and voting upon such expulsion
9 at a meeting the notice of which shall include specifications of the
10 charges against the member. Any member, provided he is joined
11 by six other members in a petition in writing therefor to the
12 board of directors, or officers having the powers of directors,
13 shall be entitled to inspect its books and records.
