AN ACT EXEMPTING CERTAIN STRUCTURES FROM THE PROVISIONS OF LAW RELATIVE TO SIGNS AND OTHER STRUCTURES PROJECTING INTO PUBLIC WAYS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 9 of chapter 85 of the General Laws, as appearing in
2 the Tercentenary Edition, is hereby amended by striking out,
3 in line 2, the word "six" and inserting in place thereof the
4 word: — twelve, — so as to read as follows: — *Section 9.* The
5 preceding section shall not apply to signs or other structures
6 projecting into or over the way a distance of less than **[six]**
7 **twelve** inches, nor to poles, wires, conduits, and appurtenances
8 of railroad, railway, telegraph and telephone, water, gas, electric
9 light, heat and power companies.
