AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE TOWN OF ARLINGTON TO CONTRIBUTE TO CERTAIN TOWN EMPLOYEES' HEALTH INSURANCE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 The town of Arlington shall contribute fifty per cent of the
- 2 prolonged illness clause of the town employees' group health
- 3 insurance plan.

By the Committee on the Judiciary, in response to a resolution of the House of Representatives, passed July 1, 1907, relating to the proposed amendment to the Constitution of the United States, to provide for the election of Senators by the people.

The Constitution of the United States

Article I, Section 3, Clause 1. The Senate of the United States shall be composed of Senators chosen by the States in the manner provided in this Article. The number of Senators from each State shall not exceed two. The States shall appoint Senators in the manner provided in this Article. The Senators shall hold their offices for six years; but no Senator shall be chosen for a term which will expire less than two years before the next meeting of the Congress to which he shall be elected. The Senators shall be chosen in the following manner: The States shall divide themselves into three equal classes, as nearly as may be, so that one class may be chosen in each year, and the number of Senators from each class shall be equal to the number of Senators from each of the other classes. The first class shall consist of one-third of the whole number of Senators then existing, the second class of one-third, and the third class of one-third. The names of the Senators of each class shall be ascertained by lot immediately after they shall have been chosen. The Senators of each class shall hold their offices for the term of years for which they were chosen, and shall be eligible for re-election at the expiration of their terms.
