AN ACT EXTENDING THE TIME WITHIN WHICH CERTAIN SOLDIERS AND SAILORS AND THEIR WIVES, WIDOWS, FATHERS OR MOTHERS MAY FILE APPLICATION FOR ABATEMENT OR EXEMPTION OF TAXES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 534 of the acts of 1949 is hereby amended by strik-
2 ing out section 3, as amended by chapter 287 of the acts of
3 1956, and inserting in place thereof the following section:—
4 *Section 3.* Application for abatement or exemption, as pro-
5 vided in sections one and two, of taxes levied in the year nine-
6 teen hundred and fifty-seven may be made not later than
7 October first, nineteen hundred and fifty-eight, notwithstand-
8 ing any provision of law to the contrary.
