**AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE TENURE OF OFFICE OF THE RODENT CONTROL OFFICER IN THE CITY OF REVERE.**

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The tenure of office of the present incumbent in  
2 the office of rodent control officer in the city of Revere shall be  
3 unlimited during good behavior.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take full effect upon its acceptance  
2 by vote of the city council of said city, subject to the provisions  
3 of its charter, but not otherwise.

I. Introduction. The purpose of this article is to explore the ethical implications of the concept of community.

It is argued that the concept of community is not merely a descriptive term, but that it has a normative force.
