By Messrs. O'Loughlin of Boston and Brown of Boston, petition of John D. Brown and Joseph M. O'Loughlin for legislation to increase the salaries of the members and the secretary of the Licensing Board for the City of Boston. Cities.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Eight.

AN ACT INCREASING THE SALARIES OF THE MEMBERS AND THE SECRETARY OF THE LICENSING BOARD FOR THE CITY OF BOSTON.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 291 of the acts of 1906 is hereby
2 amended by striking out section 2, as most recently amended by
3 section 1 of chapter 62 of the acts of 1955, and inserting in place
4 thereof the following section: —

5 *Section 2.* The annual salary of the chairman of said board
6 shall be ten thousand five hundred dollars, that of each of the
7 other two members ten thousand dollars and that of the secre-
8 tary ten thousand dollars. Such salaries shall be paid in monthly
9 instalments by the city of Boston. Subject to the approval of
10 the governor and council, said board may provide itself with
11 rooms, convenient and suitable for the performance of its duties,
12 the rent of which shall be paid by the city of Boston. Said rooms
13 shall be suitably furnished and equipped, and the expense thereof
14 shall be paid by said city upon requisition by said board.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

The Constitution of Massachusetts

As amended to the 19th of March 1878

The Constitution of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, as amended to the 19th of March 1878, is hereby published in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the Legislature, passed at the Session of 1877, Chapter 257, Section 1.
