### AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE KEEPING OF RECORDS BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The department of public works shall keep  
2 records of work done in the maintenance of all public highways.  
3 These records shall show the number of miles maintained an-  
4 nually by the department and the amount of money spent on  
5 each maintenance project.

1 SECTION 2. These records shall be open to inspection by the  
2 public.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES

Article I, Section 1

All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 1

1. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

2. No Representative shall, when elected, be less than seven Years old, seven Years a Citizen of the United States, and seven Years a Citizen of that State in which he shall be chosen.

3. Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.
