AN ACT PROVIDING THAT CLASSIFICATIONS OF RISKS AND PREMIUM CHARGES UNDER THE COMPULSORY MOTOR VEHICLE LIABILITY INSURANCE LAW BE UNIFORM THROUGHOUT THE COMMONWEALTH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 113B of chapter 175 of the General Laws, as amended,
2 is hereby further amended by striking out the first sentence of
3 the second paragraph, as appearing in section 4 of chapter 459
4 of the acts of 1935, and inserting in place thereof the following
5 sentence:—The commissioner shall, annually on or before
6 September fifteenth, after due hearing and investigation, fix and
7 establish fair and reasonable classifications of risks, and ade-
8 quate, just, reasonable and nondiscriminatory premium charges
9 to be used and charged by companies in connection with the
10 issue or execution of motor vehicle liability policies or bonds,
11 both as defined in section thirty-four A of chapter ninety, for
12 the ensuing calendar year or any part thereof, but said classifica-
13 tions and premium charges shall be uniform throughout the
14 commonwealth and shall not be fixed or established according
15 to districts or zones.
