## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Fifty-Eight.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT THE INDEMNITY PROVIDED BY CERTAIN ACCIDENT AND HEALTH POLICIES SHALL NOT BE REDUCED BECAUSE THE INSURED CARRIES OTHER INSURANCE COVERING THE SAME HAZARD.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Clause (b) of subsection 3 of section 108 of chapter  
2 175 of the General Laws, as appearing in section 1 of chapter  
3 275 of the acts of 1947, is hereby amended by striking out sub-  
4 divisions (4) and (5).

1 SECTION 2. Subsection 5 of said section 108 of said chapter  
2 175, as so appearing, is hereby amended by adding at the end  
3 the following clause: — (d) Except as provided in subdivision  
4 (3) of clause (b) of subsection three, no such policy shall be issued  
5 or delivered within the commonwealth if it contains in substance  
6 a provision limiting the amount of indemnity to a sum less than  
7 the amount stated in the policy and for which premiums have  
8 been paid in the event that the insured shall carry other in-  
9 surance covering the same hazard.
